

HIPAA requires providers using Skype to have BAAs

As expanding technology gives doctors new ways to contact patients and share their information HIPAA compliance questions continually pop up. Do the products being used protect patient data? Are additional safeguards required to comply with HIPAA? Is the product even meant to be used for healthcare purposes? In Oklahoma, Dr. Thomas Trow found out the hard way that Skype is not acceptable for use in telemedicine, contrary to his own beliefs. According to a report from NewsOK.com, Trow was using Skype to treat mental health patients he hadn't met in person after his own health began to decline. While the idea of telemedicine appealed to him, his choice of provider did not appeal to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, who placed Trow on two years of probation and ordered him to complete a prescribing practices course in September. Three of Trow's patients died while under his care, although their deaths were not related to Trow's practices. On January 16, the Oklahoma medical board ruled that all telemedicine technology must comply with HIPAA. Skype, however, does not appear to be HIPAAcompliant. Skype's privacy policy does not mention business associate agreements (BAAs), which are required by the HIPAA Omnibus rule, and Microsoft Corporation, which owns Skype, makes no mention of the product under its updated BAA announcement. The Omnibus rule requires all healthcare providers and their associates to have BAAs in place. Without a BAA, Skype is not compliant. Providers must also receive patient consent before having any video appointments. While telemedicine can be a great alternative to traditional follow-up care appointments or for use in rural settings, providers must ensure that the products they use are compliant. Products intended for physician use, like CloudVisit Telemedicine and TeleMed Psychiatry, will often have additional features for billing and scheduling, as well as data encryption.



32nd International Workshop on Analytical Psychology in Childhood and Adolescence

Belgium 5/28-31/2015

The theme of our Workshop this year will be "How do we work when the child or the adolescent refuses or stops the analysis?" This question addresses the themes of transfer and counter-transfer (including the side transfers in relation to the family and the professionals involved). It guestions also our position as analysts, and the themes of the frame (how to keep it, how to work with the other professionals and with the family), of the beginning and the ending of the analysis, and of our ethics. As usual, the Workshop is limited to 40 participants, either members or analysts in advanced training in their Societies, both child analysts and/or adult analysts. The participants are gathered in +- 10 person bilingual groups, to discuss one case study per day, presented by one of the participants. Clinical lectures should focus on a few key sessions, drawings, or dreams; it is not possible to present an entire therapy. A workshop presentation is valuable insofar as it offers the participants an opportunity to ask questions, engage in discussions, and suggest different interpretations and theorizations based on the material. Persons still in training are welcome to participate, provided that an active member of their Society introduces him/her (please send a written introduction). The first-time attendees will not present a case study. The participants are asked to take part in the entire workshop. One-day participants will not be accepted. We will be housed at "De Kluizerij" (www.dekluizerij.be) an ancient monastery located at Affligem, in Flanders, in between Brussels and Ghent. It is a green and quiet location. The building is surrounded by woods, meadows and a vineyard, and has been converted into a seminar location.

We will be organizing an outing to Brussels on Friday at the end of the afternoon and evening. On Saturday afternoon, we will discover Ghent, an old Flemish city crossed by canals. We are excited about this for coming get-together which, we hope, will be rich in friendship, creativity, and intellectual stimulation, like the 31 previous ones.

Violence and Virginia Woolf Grappling with the Root Causes of War

Is Virginia Woolf's statement that "thinking is my fighting" an aphorism that we can usefully claim for ourselves today? Her essay "Three Guineas" has been read as her attempt to grapple with the root causes of violence and war, and she articulates several conceptions of peace throughout her literary output. Peace Studies, an interdisciplinary academic discipline and area of scholarly research that first became formalized as part of college curricula in 1948, debates theories of peace, including those put forth in Woolf's work. This lecture explores the ways in which Woolf's responses to violence and war contributed to the formulation of definitions of "positive" peace and helped establish an intellectual climate in which the discipline of Peace Studies and peace research have prospered. The lecture is followed by discussion and a social gathering.


