Through working with the mesa, we will learn the secrets, myths, and knowledge of the ancient Incan healers and visionaries from master ceremonialist Adolfo who carries the direct Incan lineage.

Birmingham Bound! As a way of enticing you to Birmingham, I want to continue what I started in Denver when I spoke a bit about what awaits you here in the Deep South. Along with the Civil Rights District and Art Museum which are within walking distance from the Sheraton, I now want to lure you with the anticipation of the gastronomic delights that await you.

Frank Stitt is a world famous chef from right up the road in Cullman, Alabama. His restaurants have put Birmingham on the culinary map and I can personally recommend all four of them. They are a short trolley or cab ride away from the hotel in the Five Points South area. The flagship is Highlands Bar and Grill (reservations necessary) and following in no particular order are Chez Fon Fon (doesn't take reservations), Bottega Restaurant (reservations necessary) and Bottega Cafe (doesn't take reservations). Look them up on the internet and drool.

Also in the same location (Five Points South) are The Veranda (New Orleans cuisine), Hot and Hot Fish Club (Outstanding), Jim and Nick's Barbecue (not to be missed if you want real Southern BBQ or meat and three), and Surin West (Thai food).

There are also wonderful lunch places downtown and a few white cloth restaurants that stay open at night. There is a lovely restaurant in the Art Museum as well. The area around the hotel has restaurants, and they are also the kind that can be found in any convention area.

The latest issue of National Geographic Traveler has a wonderful article on Birmingham. It mentions Nikki's West, an iconic "Meat and Three" restaurant. Another of this ilk is the Irondale Cafe, made famous by the movie Fried Green Tomatoes. Both of these are a cab ride away.
