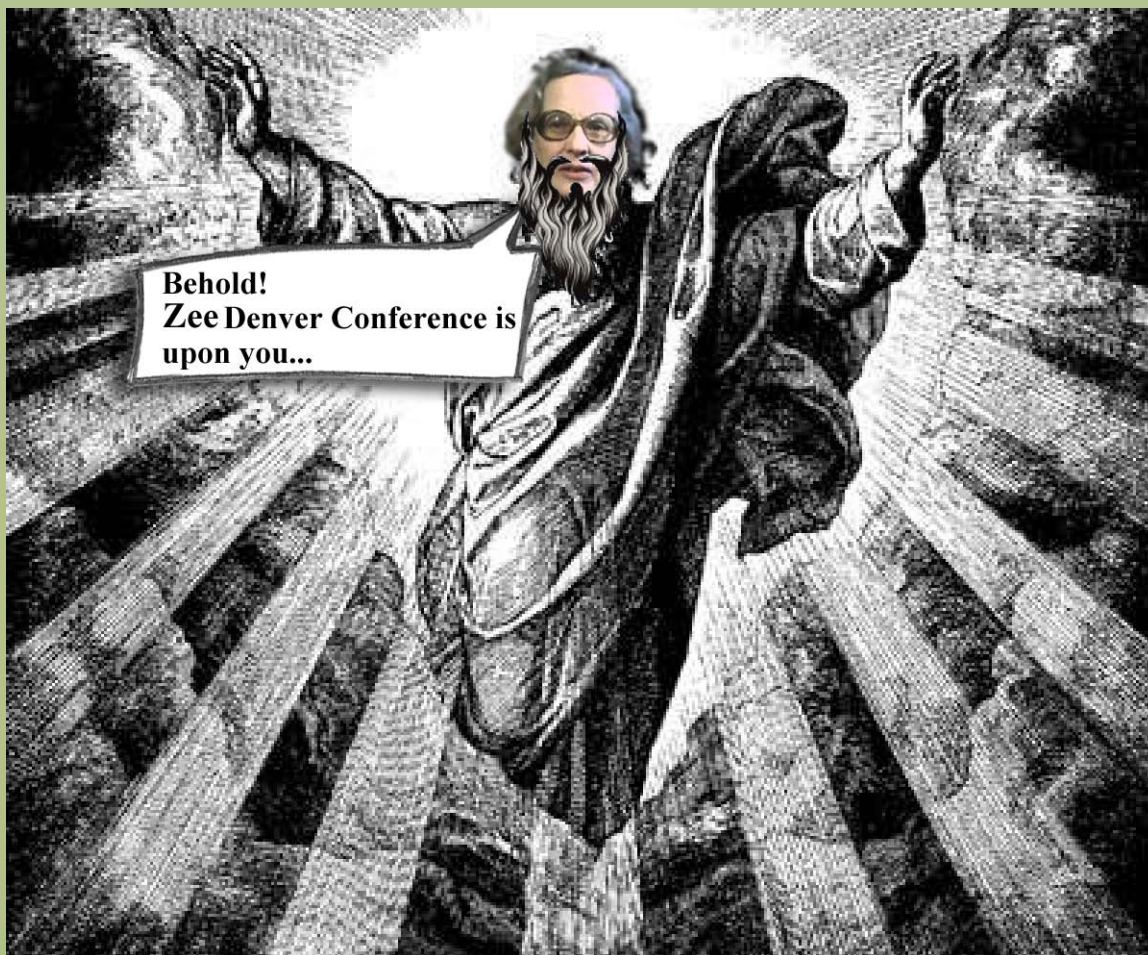

The Varieties of Jungian Clinical Experience:

This conference takes place a century after the founding of The Association for Analytical Psychology in July 1914, consequent to the final rift between Freud and Jung the previous year. But since that time cross-fertilisation influences have continued to modify our practice: the developmental approach of Michael Fordham and his introduction of child analysis had allowed some rapprochement with the psychoanalytic mainstream whilst more recently the influence of relational and intersubjective approaches has been to the fore. What are our current views about our contemporary Jungian clinical practice? Do we still feel a tension between 'synthetic' and 'reductive' analysis? And how are we influenced by the particular milieu - geographical and cultural - in which we practise analytical psychology? Speakers include: Verena Kast, Ann Lammers, Christian Maier, Andrew Samuels, Martin Schmidt, Giovanni Sorge, Matthias von der Tann, Jan Wiener. There will be a Pre Conference Clinical Writing Workshop before the conference planned for Thursday 29th May from 9am to 3pm led by Joe Cambrey and Jan Wiener. More details in "Programme". 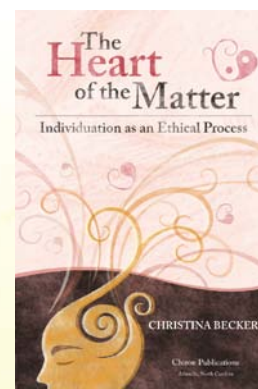



**International Interdisciplinary Conference:
 The Theory of C.G. Jung - Interdisciplinary Research
 Wroclaw University, Wroclaw, Poland, June 12-14, 2014**

In various fields of contemporary scientific research ongoing discussions regarding the validity and value of C. G. Jung's theory of the human psyche and its relationship to the world is slowly gaining momentum. At the same time this theory is among the most quoted and commented on among contemporary psychological theories. Jungian concepts and assumptions are used today in many areas where the scientists seek to build bridges between psychology and other areas of science. A paradox, however, remains that despite such clear resonance with disciplines engaged in reflection on the consciousness and the environment, this approach seems not to be employed by contemporary academic psychology nor is it a part of related research programs. Jungian theory is treated rather as solely of historical interest and not as the theory worthy of further development. To fill this explicit gap we wish to propose collective, wider reflections which will articulate the key Jungian concepts and findings that seem to have stood the test of time and have been proven valuable from the point of view of scientific discourse. Thus the proposed conference is directed not only to Jungian scholars, Jungian analysts, psychologists or psychiatrists, but also to the researchers representing other general areas: philosophy, physics, anthropology, sociology, cultural studies, political science, biology, medicine etc. A major task will be to outline the contemporary usefulness and applicability of Jung's ideas at the beginning of XXI century while simultaneously making a critical review of this theory.

David Schoen: "I wanted to let my IRSJA friends and colleagues know how I'm doing in my night sea journey. I am home now from the rehab in the hospital. Getting PT and OT several times a week. I could finally see some progress for the first time this week, though others tell me they've seen it for a while. When I came out of surgery I could not walk, see, eat, write or talk. Now I am walking with a cane and a walker, still using a wheelchair. My vision has improved. I don't see double anymore and I can read some now.
