
He was a voice crying out in the wilderness when he first spoke of a coming spiritual crisis, a grave danger to civilization, if not to all human existence. Today Carl Jung's warning is our lived reality. Our world's speeding changes have ripped away our tether to the known, creating sharp divisions marked by suspicion, dissention and defensive over-reaction. Hostility is not new to humanity, but the technology that can turn hostility into massive destruction is new. Only individual consciousness, said Jung, can save us from our own destructive innovations and create a new order for a changing world.

In a hostile and hotly-divided world, is civil, meaningful, conscious dialogue still possible? We live with broadcasters of every ilk using exaggerations and half truths to exploit the fears of listeners. Bloggers fill pages with venom. Discussions of social policies have become shouting matches. Listening and compromise are often mistaken for weakness. A disproportionate amount of our national budget (no one seems to know exactly how much) is dedicated to mechanisms of war, euphemistically referred to as "defense." Though kindness, relatedness and moral courage can still be found, qualities of eros are overshadowed, bringing us to the spiritual crisis that Jung foresaw.

We invite you to join us as we explore what relatedness means in a crowded, hostile world, and what Jung meant when he said individual consciousness is the best, perhaps only, hope for civilization. As diverse ideologies touch and clash in a shrinking world, he spoke of the acute need for mutual understanding, adding "Making oneself understood is impossible without comprehension of the other's viewpoint."

The Orphan: A Journey to Wholeness

The Orphan: A Journey to Wholeness addresses loneliness and the feeling of being alone in the world, two distinct characteristics that mark the life of an orphan. Regardless if we have grown up with or without parents, we are all too likely to meet such experiences in ourselves and in our daily encounters with others. With numerous case examples, Dr. Punnett describes how loneliness and the feeling of being alone tend to be repeated in later relationships and may eventually lead to states of anxiety and depression. The main purpose of this book is not to just stay within the context of the literal orphan, but also to explore its symbolic dimensions in order to provide meaning to the diverse experiences of feeling alone in the world. In accepting the orphan within, we begin to take responsibility for our own unique life journey, a privileged journey in which one can at some point in time say with pride, I am an orphan.

Audrey F Punnett, PhD, is a graduate of the C.G. Jung Institute, Zurich with diplomas in both Child/Adolescent and Adult Analytical Psychology. She is an Associate Clinical Professor, Psychiatry, the University of California San Francisco – Fresno; Adjunct Professor, Alliant International University; Registered Play Therapist – Supervisor, and Certified Sandplay Therapist – Teacher, ISST & STA, past President of the Board of Trustees. She is a member of AGAP, serving on the Board, and the CGJI-SF, past Chair of the Infant, Child & Adolescent Training Committee (iCAT). She has lectured and given workshops on the orphan in Europe, New Zealand, Taiwan, Canada and the USA, and published in peer reviewed Journals. Dr. Punnett maintains a private practice in Fresno, California.


Call for Papers


