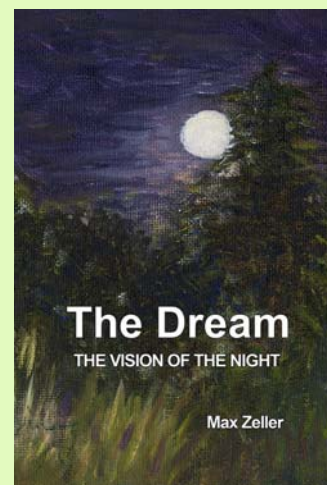

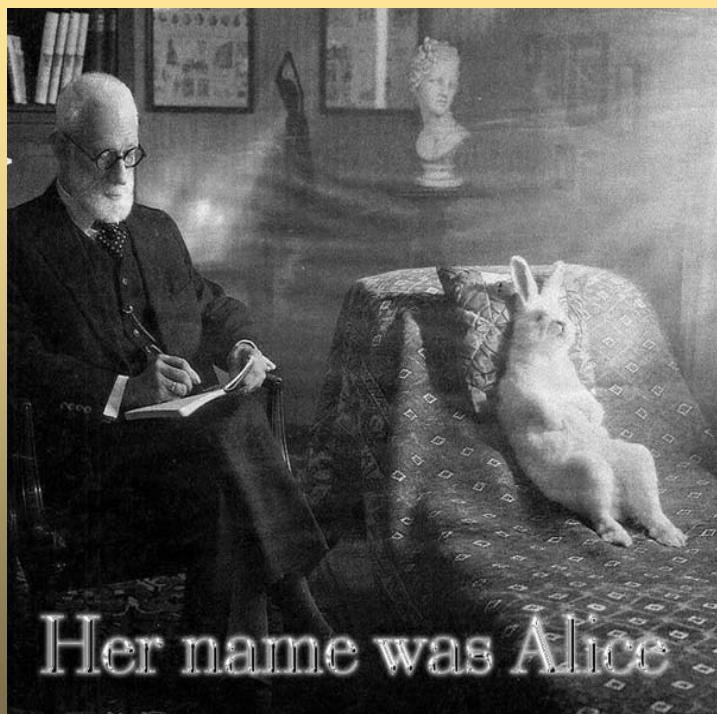

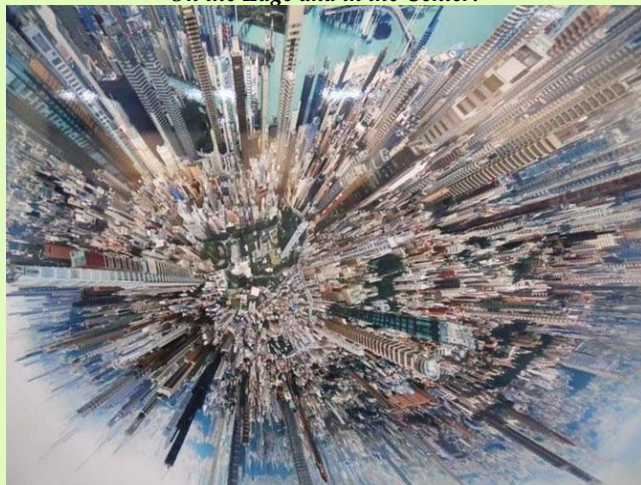

The theme of this gathering sets the stage for us to join in explorations of questions that penetrate the assumptions of our work: Is there a center or many centers to psyche? What lies at the edges and beyond? How do we imagine the interaction between center and edges in both individual and collective dynamics, in both intrapsychic and interpersonal dimensions? To launch our time together, we have invited two scholars, each renowned and in the center of their own fields, who are dynamically edgy and thus stimulating to Jungian thought. 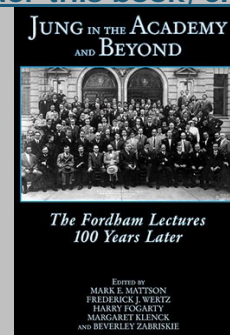
