The theme of this gathering sets the stage for us to join in explorations of questions that penetrate the assumptions of our work: Is there a center or many centers to psyche? Brian Feldman, Ph.D., will coordinate the weekend with an emphasis on **Infant and Adult Attachment as affected by developmental, environmental and cultural issues.**

The emergence of primitive/infantile mental states within the transference/countertransference relationship will be explored as well as how we as analysts reflect upon, hold and contain primitive/infantile emotional states and how the analytic exploration of these mental states promotes integration and individuation. New Book

The Solar Myths and Opicinus de Canistris

Notes of the Seminar given at Eranos in 1943

Edited by Riccardo Bernardini, Gian Piero Quaglini and Augusto Romano

200 pages, illustrated, ISBN 978-3-85630-756-1

C.G. Jung held an 'extemporaneous' seminar on "The Solar Myths and Opicinus de Canistris" at the 1943 Eranos Conference. In a complete version for the first time, this book presents all of the known material relating to the seminar, including notes taken by two of his students, Alwine von Keller and Rivkah Schärf Kluger, and the outline that Jung himself prepared. Opicinus de Canistris (1296-c. 1352) was a priest and cartographer from near Pavia, Italy. His typically medieval cartography is characterized by historical, theological, symbolic and astrological references along with a curious anthropomorphism, which depicted continents and oceans with human features. Jung recognized this as a projection of Opicinus' inner world and interpreted the maps of the world as mandalas, where the integration of the shadow, the dark principle, was missing.

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Gosh, it was so good to hear about you and what's happening in the Inter Regional through Joseph and Tim at our last monthly BOLA meeting here in Tidewater. I understand that some of you learned about my health situation when Joseph gave the news about absent colleagues. I remember when I used to give the "collegiality" report. I think Karen Magee did it too. Now we are being reported on!

October 3, 2013 is the day I learned when I woke up from a 7 hour instead of a 2 hour operation, that I had lung cancer in the lining of my left bottom lobe. The lobe had been excised on the spot when the biopsy results came back. No chemo after that first surgery is the protocol until the cancer returns. It did the following August. Early in that month I had a dream in which a couple, the K's, I had been close to in my twenties and thirties, "returned to visit us in our home." Betty K., who had been a close friend for over 20 years contracted lung cancer after we had moved from Texas to Virginia in the early 80's. That dream gave me a possible heads up before I had a procedure in late August which let the oncologist know that cancer had returned and was also on the lining of my remaining left lung. I had another surgery at Duke Medical Ctr for thoracic oncology December 1 2014. It was palliative and diagnostic. I have the ALK mutation.

Right now I am feeling well and strong with plenty of energy. Perhaps Joseph is able to include a picture he took of me at our meeting on April 26th. I am continuing PT with goal of getting back in regular Y classes with my husband, Paul. Walking one to three miles a day. Seeing a few folks in therapy and spiritual direction. I am serving at the altar on Sundays again at the main service.

Tomorrow when I see Dr Cross we find out what's happening now following a bout of severe pneumonia (in February) in my right lobe and having to go off the chemo for a while. I have been back on for about a month now (oral 2xday) and had a recent CT scan with contrast to see what's what. I ask for your sending of light and prayers as we see what's next. This comes with much affection and gratitude for all the years we spent working and playing together at InterRegional meetings all over the place! (1986-2012).
