In 2012, Alchemy was one of 12 programs to receive the National Arts and Humanities Youth Program Award by the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities, the nation's highest honor for afterschool and out-of-school programs. Alchemy is also the backdrop in full-length documentary film "Finding the Gold Within" by Karina Epperlein (<u>http://goldthefilm.com/</u>). Three years in the making and released in 2014, the film has been featured in Mill Valley Film Festival and the Cleveland International Film Festival.


