'Opening the Vault of the Heart' is a dramatic reading of select scenes from The Red Book of C.G. Jung. Sourced from Jung's experiences around the loss and reclamation of his soul in a time of deep chaos, his dramatic encounters with archetypal figures reveal not only the origin of many of his psychological ideas but offer a felt experience of his mid-life journey. Working through the effects of personal and collective trauma and the loss of a sense of connection to something greater than himself, Jung embarks on the creation of his own cosmology.

The images and dialogues in The Red Book creatively evoke the history and complex political and psychological issues of Jung's time – a time whose instability and loss of meaning is resonant with our own. His dialogues with Salome, The Red One and Philemon, along with the other ancient, wise and wayward characters who stride across the stages of his psychic life, illuminate the inherent multiplicity, diversity and democracy necessary for the health of the psyche – both individually and collectively.
