THE RED BOOK: OPENING THE VAULT OF THE HEART

Published in 2009, *The Red Book* opened up a visually stunning and linguistically stimulating way to explore many of Jung's foundational ideas. Today there are well over 70 published essays by analysts, artists, historians and theologians who consider Jung from widely varying points of view. For some he is a genuine prophet in the Gnostic tradition; for others the brilliant, innovative psychologist whose theory of a collective unconscious filled with archetypal others provides a transdisciplinary bridge for both personal and social transformation. Still more find his active imaginations and use of prophetic language a defensive maneuver around developmental wounds. Most would agree, however, that the imaginal dialogues with the characters who stride across the stages of his psychic life appear to have been ultimately healing for Jung in a time of great personal and collective stress, ultimately underscoring the curative alchemy of the Imagination and the 'thirdness' possible from such encounters.

The dialogues in the play are sourced directly from *The Red Book*. However, Marilyn Marshall, my inspired and inspiring co-author and I have, of necessity, edited some scenes and imagined a couple of others. In the latter, we are responding with our own imagination to Jung as a way of exploring what the *Red Book* means to each of us. In the process of bringing in a cast of analysts, who have lent their imagination and prodigious talent to the characters they play with, we hope we might stimulate your own imagination in exploring the meaning of the *Red Book* for our time.

Because we teach about *The Red Book*, it has been important to Marilyn and myself to hold the tension between a purely didactic perspective and the creation of a safe, playful space for dramatic expression where Jung's personal mystery play has the chance to potentially touch the mystery of one's own's individuality. We have striven for an embodied approach in the work that engages both mind and heart. As Sonu Shamdasani deftly explains, engaging the *Red Book* is an opportunity to witness a psyche creating its own cosmology; it is an invitation to enter into one's own creative meaning-making process where the present may be renewed by the past and the past re-visioned in the present.

The play has been a labor of love, a work of the heart assembled in between the busy lives of a wonderful, dedicated cast led by the deeply soulful, inspired performance of Jung provided by Carolyn Bates.

The situation is urgent. My original Lecture and Seminar were to be presented at the AGAP Forum last June, but the entire meeting was cancelled [COVID]. When I shared it privately, the analysts/business professionals insisted that I make my formulations available, ASAP, to the public. So, I built a promotion campaign (on FaceBook) with on-line payment and registration. And expanded my talk into vibrant LIVE webinars based on colorful image-filled PowerPoint presentations that can convey to a lay public the archetypal processes that are at work.

I'm convinced that Jungian psychology is the ONLY hope for making sense of the destructive, fear-driven, rabid belief in the 'BAD MYTHOLOGY' -- e.g., QAnon conspiracy theories, the Trump 'they stole the election' belief system -- that is driving a stake into our democracy. So I'm very eager to share this and work together within our Jungian community. If you have suggestions for how that would work, and/or how I can reach more of the general public, I would deeply appreciate hearing from you!

**Making Sense of Extreme Right Nationalism:
The Peter Pan Complex and the Negative Father Archetype in Our Times**

Webinar 1. Extreme Right Nationalism: Has our society's Peter Pan complex turned violent?

We look at how the *puer aeternus* complex is strikingly illustrated in the golden statue of D. Trump at the CPAC conference, held days after the insurrection. And how a powerful cultural negative father complex has been evolving: from the mythology of the ancient Greeks to our modern Star Wars -- the most popular film series every decade since the 1980s.

Webinar 2. The Dark Side of the Peter Pan Complex – Why does it turn violent? How did we get from the good son / bad father of Star Wars to the current wildly angry ‘bad boys’ [Proud Boys, etc.] intent on destroying everything that smacks of ‘good father’? We examine the *puer/senex* cultural complex and how eternal youth figures can evolve into evil and destructive figures, from Hitler to the film “The Joker.”

Webinar 3. The Problem With 'The Father': What's gone so wrong in our society? We turn to the brilliant scholarship of Luigi Zoja in *The Father*, on how societies can undermine the good father function, within the family and in social structures. How the Fascist and Nazi movements of post-WWI arose from failing societal ‘good father’ structures, and how that trend has continued.

From Nancy Swift Furlotti regarding her recent activities:

Hello fellow analysts and candidates,

I offer an update on projects I have been involved with these last few years.

1. I gave the 2021 Fay Lectures at the Jung Center in Houston producing a book that will be forthcoming from Texas A&M. The title is: ***The Splendor of the Maya: A Journey into the Shadows at the Dawn of Creation***

Returning to history and lessons from the past, we explore the Quiché Maya creation myth from Mesoamerica, called *The Popol Vuh* or The Book of Council. It is a striking example of a story that lays out a template for humanity to live in balance with spirit and nature. This detailed and funny myth is particularly important because it represents the collective mindset of a very sophisticated civilization that evolved in America, uninfluenced by the rest of the world except through the shared objective psyche. We will look at the culture, its unique contributions and then proceed to amplify the myth from a Jungian point of view.

2. A very interesting professional documentary titled, *Soulheal*, discusses the current psychological crisis facing men today. James Hollis and I are interviewed. It was the Semi-Finalist at the 2021 Vancouver Independent Film Festival and was short listed at the 2021 Indie Shorts Canne Film Festival.

“Men are in crisis. Who are they supposed to be? What makes a "real" man? Wounded from the absence of helpful fathers and the cyclical generational damage to their forefathers, men live with fear and are driven by shame. Men must heal themselves. It's now or never: achieve wholeness or face destruction.”

3. I gave the 2022 Zurich Lecture Series titled: *The Lasting Relevance and Vision of Erich Neumann*.

Who is Erich Neumann, the brilliant early Jungian who lived in Israel, close friend and collaborator of C.G. Jung, and why is he so important in the development of Analytical Psychology?



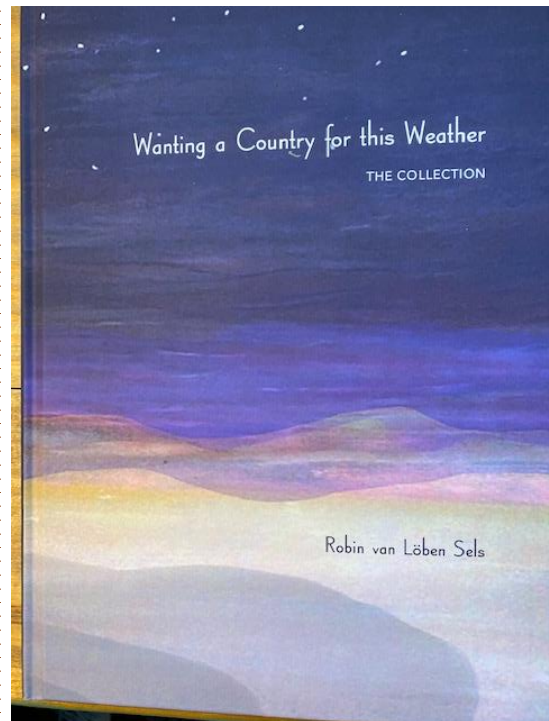

Information and a 2023 Wishlist from *Jan Stannard*, your Facebook Coordinator



It was good to see many of you again at the Fall Meeting recently. During my presentation I explained how the Photo Directory is produced. I felt it might be helpful to share that process again here for those who couldn't make the meeting or those who might have questions.

- The template for the directory is the membership section of our website: irsja.org.
- You can log into the website and make changes to your profile yourself, or I am happy to edit your information or swap out your photo for you on request.
- The deadline to make changes for inclusion in next year's directory is June 30th, after which the site (i.e. member photos and information) will be exported for further work. So, if you change your email or mailing address and the change is not made correctly on the website by 6/30, your information which appears in the directory may be out of date and IRSJA may not be able to contact you. And every year I get directories returned to me as undeliverable.

It is the interest of all of us to have an accurate Photo Directory. Many members find it more convenient to have their copy on hand rather than log in to the website. So here's my wishlist for 2023:

- Please send me your changes – or notify me if you make them yourself – whenever they occur. It's easier to remember to do it that way (and I don't get swamped with a zillion emails at the end of June! 😊)
- If you have trouble logging in or have any other questions, let me know! Others may be having the same issue and if I don't know, I can't help.
- Remember to specify your **preferred** mailing address! That is important especially for mailing the directories. Many members closed their offices during COVID but failed to change their preferred address to home, causing some directories to be returned as undeliverable.
- Please understand that there may be errors or omissions over which I have no control, including changes made after the June 30th (although exceptions are made occasionally e.g. resignations or – sadly - deaths, if not too close to the printer's deadline.)

Remember: the information in the Photo Directory is only as good as that which **you** – the membership provides!

Lastly, I will be sending updates to the current Photo Directory soon, so watch for the email!
