# The C.G. Jung Foundation for Analytical Psychology, Inc., New York Presents: *Psychopathy and the Power of Eros*

This program is based on Dr. Maram's book *Psychopathy Within (Chiron, 2016)*, which offers a new way of conceptualizing and defining psychopathy that represented a convergence of her divergent professional experiences as a forensic and clinical psychologist, a Jungian-oriented psychotherapist, and her own experiences as a Jungian student and analysand. A book review by Jungian analyst Thomas Elsner gets to the heart of this Summer Study presentation:

*"Psychopathy Within* is an expression of the Feminine principle of Eros. Guiding us through the labyrinths of the human heart in its experience of psychopathy, an experience described qualitatively by Dr. Eve Maram as a sense of something deep within that is missing and that exists in a dormant continuum with all of us, Dr. Maram draws on her experiences as a forensic psychologist, a Jungian therapist, and most centrally, a daughter to a father who suffered from psychopathy, to challenge the strict separation of "us" and "them" in diagnostic criteria and in relationship.

Beyond the yearnings to make logical sense of psychopathy, she eloquently expresses the ways in which Eros, or the Feminine Principle, is often missing or devalued in both professional work and in personal life. . . . By going consciously into dark experiences of psychopathy with love, appreciation for symbol, compassion, and a touch of humor, Dr. Maram shows us the gold, the possibility of authentic life, that lies hidden in what seems most unacceptable and most destructive to ourselves and others."



# The latest from Mark Winborn:

*Jungian Psychoanalysis: A Contemporary Introduction* - a new book by Mark Winborn which will be released by Routledge on August 31, 2023, as part of the Routledge Series *Contemporary Introductions to Psychoanalysis.* As with other volumes in the series, this volume is not positioned as an introduction to Jung for the general public. It provides a succinct introduction to Jung's main ideas but also outlines the debates and critiques of Jung's theoretical framework across the decades. Additionally, it highlights the similarities and differences between Jung's model and concepts from various schools of contemporary psychoanalysis. As such, it serves as an introduction to the Jungian model for psychoanalysts and psychotherapists from other psychoanalytic orientations, orients the experienced Jungian clinician to the overlap between Jungian concepts and contemporary psychoanalysis, and it serves as a concise distillation of material essential to candidates for propaedeuticum examination preparation.



This book brilliantly outlines and integrates a breadth of understanding of Jung's depth psychology in concert with contemporary psychoanalytic theory and practice. A much needed and timely opus, this volume is a feast of psychoanalytic knowledge punctuated with moving personal clinical experience and wisdom. A gem for Jungians and all those devoted to psyche. # SEEKING ANALYSTS TO PROVIDE REDUCED FEE CASE CONSULTATION FOR IRSJA CANDIDATES

In spring 2021, Kaitryn Wertz compiled a list of analysts who are willing to provide consultation (formerly called supervision) to IRSJA training candidates at a reduced fee. In agreement with Kaitryn, the candidates are now maintaining the list and it is being updated annually. If you are not already on the list and are willing to provide consultation at a reduced fee to at least one candidate, please e-mail Carrie Remmell at <u>carrieremmell@gmail.com</u>. I will e-mail you a brief form to complete. The information you provide will be added to the list available to candidates. The fee will be agreed upon between the analyst and candidate.

The candidates are deeply grateful to those analysts who are able to offer a reduced fee for consultation. This helps contain the costs of training for all candidates, especially pre-control candidates admitted since spring 2021 because their consultation hour requirements have increased from 12 to 40 hours per year. Thank you.

*Please note:* Per the IRSJA training manual, analysts must have five years postgraduation experience to provide consultation to pre-control candidates. Analysts providing consultation to control candidates must also have five years post-graduation experience.

# From Brenda Bunting:

I was asked to introduce myself as one of the newer IRSJA analysts who had my official graduation this year in Santa Fe. I am from Toronto, Canada, and trained with the Pittsburgh Seminar and the Philadelphia Colloquium. I am a trained art therapist and worked for many years in community mental health.

My thesis was called *The Butterfly Queen: The Psycho-spiritual Journey of a Woman at the End of Life.* It was about accompanying a woman living with cancer. She passed in 2019 a month before my cases exam. I spent the next year writing about the experience, so when the pandemic hit it strangely amplified what I had already been immersed in thinking about. I was grateful to my thesis committee, Marla, Virginia and Charles for offering to examine me for graduation using Zoom in 2020. I had not even considered the possibility.



Currently, I am serving on the Executive Committee as Treasurer. I have had the pleasure of talking to many you in that capacity and I am happy that the membership passed the motion to no longer charge members over 85 years of age dues starting in 2024.

In my spare time these days on summer weekends I can be found working on finishing the inside of my little cabin in the woods by a small no-motor lake with the help of my mechanically-gifted partner.
