

In the early twentieth century C. G. Jung survived an intense encounter with the unconscious. He did this by giving expression to his inner world in the paintings and dialogues found in *The Red Book*. Yet Jung felt alone in this work, unable to find a precedent or cultural parallel, until he discovered alchemy. This ancient "protoscience" became the bridge Jung had been seeking between the remote past and the present. Yet between the downfall of alchemy in the eighteenth century and Jung's Red Book in the twentieth, it seems that there was a gap in the tradition.

Samuel Taylor Coleridge's great visionary poem "The Rime of the Ancient Mariner" is another link in that golden chain. Coleridge's 19th century night-sea journey can today be understood as a symbolic self-portrait of the collective unconscious, a self-portrait that, like *The Red Book*, finds its historical context and continuity in the alchemical tradition. Insofar as Coleridge's *Ancient Mariner* symbolically describes the birth of the modern soul, it is grounded in the factual knowledge of European history. **Insofar as it describes the death and rebirth of the modern soul**, *The Ancient Mariner* is prophecy and revelation.

BOOK DESCRIPTION

Giving the lie to psychology's having long ago dropped the word "soul" from its vocabulary, the authors of these essays tenaciously explore the theme of "psychology in modernity" by asking with respect to our times, "Where is soul?"

Having come together for a symposium in Berlin in the summer of 2024, Jungian analysts and scholars from Canada, Germany, Switzerland, Japan, England, Spain and the United States presented papers on such topics as interiority and accomplished modernity, Jung's thematization of the spiritual problem of modern man, technology as antichrist, the logic of love in relation to the Holocaust, human dignity, the psychology of simulation, the search for the arcane substance, reflexivity and the edge of the psychological, Mexican shamanic experience as the other of modernity's linguistic turn, and the soulful significance in modern Japan of love suicide, Minamata disease, and the creation of outer space as this pertains to "the birth of man."

To Our IRSJA Colleagues,

It is with very heavy hearts that we bring you this message. Recent political developments that are dramatically impacting all of us have particularly dire consequences for our country. As Canadians, we are compelled personally and collectively to take as much action as is available in support of our country. However, our decision is conflicted and we felt it was important to convey our sentiments to our close IRSJA friends and colleagues.

U.S. newsfeeds convey limited details of the real emerging Canadian crisis, usually only focusing on the erroneous arguments and humiliating charges levelled at our country. The new tariffs going into effect have already initiated harsh impacts on both side of the border. Many of our essential manufacturing industries will be severely battered, or even destroyed, with extreme repercussions for other businesses and the lives of the people who depend on them.

The further deeply insulting presumptions and very real threats to our sovereignty amplify these economic impacts and inflict even deeper psychic wounds that are as frightening as they are intolerable.

As individual citizens, our gestures feel small and insignificant; however, across the country, Canadians are uniting in curtailing travel and other economic dealings with the United States. We are joining in this movement. Brenda Bunting and Tim Pilgrim will not be travelling to Boulder this spring. Christina Becker, whose VP role is essential to the conference will be onsite for this one conference; however, she, along with Brenda will not be standing for re-election after they finish their current terms.

We of course will continue to do what we can to serve IRSJA remotely; however, our decisions have ramifications for the committees on which we serve and duties that we perform. We feel very badly that friends and colleagues will be impacted by our absence, but we hope you understand our position and the necessity of joining others in our country to take a stand. Hopefully, we can all stand together to understand and deal with the Shadow that is upon us.

SEEKING ANALYSTS TO PROVIDE REDUCED FEE CASE CONSULTATION FOR IRSJA CANDIDATES


In spring 2021, Kaitryn Wertz compiled a list of analysts who are willing to provide consultation (formerly called supervision) to IRSJA training candidates at a reduced fee. In agreement with Kaitryn, the candidates are now maintaining the list and it is updated annually. If you are not already on the list and are willing to provide consultation at a reduced fee to at least one candidate, please e-mail Carrie Remmell at carrieremmell@gmail.com. I will e-mail you a brief form to complete. The information you provide will be added to the list available to candidates. The fee will be agreed upon between the analyst and candidate.

The candidates are deeply grateful to those analysts who are able to offer a reduced fee for consultation. This helps contain the costs of training for all candidates, especially pre-control candidates admitted since spring 2021 because their consultation hour requirements have increased from 12 to 40 hours per year. Thank you.

Please note: Per the IRSJA training manual, analysts must have five years post-graduation experience to provide consultation to pre-control candidates. Analysts providing consultation to control candidates must also have five years post-graduation experience.



Controversies & Contemporary Trends in Analytical Psychology

ONLINE, 7-8 November 2025

The first issue of the *Journal of Analytical Psychology* was published in January 1955. It was dedicated to C. G. Jung on the occasion of his 80th birthday. While honouring the "truly gigantic and fundamental nature of Jung's labours", the editorial of this first edition states that Jung's concepts nevertheless "need to be subjected to scrutiny, constructive criticism, and elaboration." This objective still holds true. However, while at the time the opportunity to publish articles in the *Journal* was open to members of the Society of Analytical Psychology only, the *Journal* has grown to be one of the leading journals in the field of analytical psychology with an international outlook, inviting papers from authors around the globe and hosting an editorial board and team that reflects a wide variety of cultures and traditions.

To celebrate our 70th anniversary, the *Journal* will host an online conference to reflect on important past and present controversies and contemporary trends. Fromer US Editor-in-Chief John Beebe will discuss the *Journal's* historical development and attitudes towards classical, developmental and relational approaches. Saturday's distinguished speakers – Christian Roesler, Eric Goodwyn, Susanna Wright, Mark Winborn, Jean Knox, Joe Cambray, Kevin Lu and Sam Kimbles) will focus on present-day developments and controversies: the debate on the nature of archetypes, countertransference, in its many manifestations in the consulting room, the role of affectivity, implicit memory, attachment and cultural complexes.

This online conference welcomes participants from around the globe to take part. Recordings will be made available to those who are unable to attend on the day or who live in time zones which are unfavourable to live participation.

INVITATION INTO THE WORKS OF TOM ELSNER

If you would like to spend time with Tom and his muse, the links below will help guide you.

The depth of Tom's care for the psyche, for the world's soul, is so present in each of these offerings.

Tom's love from the beginning was fairy tales and animals. (There is a podcast below in which Tom talks with Dr. Dave on Shrinkrapradio.com about fairy tales and animals. It is a lively transmission!) Gotti Isler's capacity with fairytales lit a hermetic light in Tom, way back during training at the Zentrum in Switzerland. This flame was ever-present in Tom's pleasure in discovering the living ground of images and the symbolizing field...that magic that happens when stories come alive. Tom had an alchemical gift here, and many of you likely remember his capacity to let the story speak, the images come alive and the delicious slow process of being worked on by a story be held by Tom in group readings. Tom's lifelong love of literature, and the structures of the psyche in fairy tales, poetry and stories was fundamental to Tom's attraction to depth psychology from the beginning, and you can feel that in the foundation of him and how this ripened in his work over time and blossomed in his book on Coleridge.

I know you will discover all sorts of themes he loved in these works. He had such a heart for the political mess we are in and the call to deep inner work with <u>The Introversion of War</u> as antidote. (see below) And all the new creations happening with Psychological Perspectives and the podcast, lit Tom up so, and in fact until his last few months of life. Tom has numerous offerings as you can see, and each opens to its own unique landscape. There are just a few I hoped to point out, so you don't miss them.

I feel Tom lived <u>The Three Languages</u>, so don't miss this offering in particular. From the beginning of training he found his own myth in that fairy tale and in hindsight now, how clearly he lived this myth.

And <u>The Voice in Madness Wanting</u> shows the cutting edge of Tom's passion for the true depths from the beginning, and his love of Ross Woodman; that imprint with Ross lives on so strongly in all of Tom's writing. (Those two shared at times a common flame.)

And then of course, there is Tom's voice in the podcasts...each of them is full of Tom's essence. And Orange County Friends of Jung's video of Tom's talk with them is especially deep and prescient, and mirrors the reality of Tom's Pluto Sun opposition of many years:

On the Threshold of Transformation: Liminality and Symbolic Death.

As many of you are aware, Tom's book, A Flash of Golden Fire: The Birth, Death, and Rebirth of the Modern Soul in Coleridge's "The Rime of the Ancient Mariner" was just published. The work will speak for itself, and I am shy to try to convey to you the potency of what is in this work that Tom spent twenty three years of his life working on. At this time in the grieving process I am sorry to say I cannot do the depth and complexity of Tom's book justice. There are so many levels of reality he is holding as he weaves along, and the research in the book into depth psychology's roots, the Romantic poets, is like no other source. So much of depth psychology will find its origins in so many discoveries Coleridge was making in the psyche before Jung that parallel in word, vision and mythological concept. This is just one thread in this mighty opus. The transformation of the western psyche is the whole of it. And Tom brings out the music in the symbols of Coleridge's great work, the Rime to carry us along through the transmutations of the western psyche through the centuries. Because of the mythos of the work carries such deep archetypal patterns of initiation and awakening, the overall structure of the book feels like the back bone of the whale of the Self, as I believe you will see.

The last chapter, the epilogue in Tom's Book is all about Tom's life, his early life history, his wound, his being drawn to the psyche in various ways, his vision of things. When his son Bennett heard us read this out loud to Tom together days before Tom died, Bennett said at

the end, "I wish the whole book was like this, I want to know more about Dad and how he sees his life." So, all to say, you don't want to miss the epilogue of Tom looking into his life and honoring that he also had just been diagnosed with cancer. It is quite a moment and quite a voice in him holding his life. I am so grateful he decided to share himself this way with all of us.

And finally, you may find, that the last piece Tom wrote before he died, <u>Humanity's Greatest Dilemma</u>: <u>Reflections on the work of Nathan Schwartz Salant</u>, (which is a chapter within the upcoming Chiron Publications book Living with Fire, listed below), is quite possibly the most important offering illuminating the depths in writing from Tom and his muse. How honestly and courageously Tom held his grail cup in this life; this sings in this essay. Tom illuminates for us how the work of Nathan Schwartz Salant and Jung have affected Tom's vision and relationship to the psyche, and to the spirit archetype.

The reality of the psyche as Tom knew it deepens in this chapter as he muses on "the three pieces of meat Nathan threw to me", as Tom says it. And, as many of you would expect, Tom, in this offering, transparently suffers his own inner dialog and offers some challenges for the dialogue of depth psychology itself in the world today. From this ground in this work, laid out so transparently during the encounter with cancer and the nearness of death, a new voice is sent up, and a new man becoming himself is forming in the process of this piece. And we readers are offered an intimate glimpse.

For now, because music was Tom's first love, I want to leave you with a song that feels like the essence of Tom right now singing perfectly into present moment, into the dialog where love is stronger than death.

Joe Cocker's song, Have a Little Faith in Me. Have A Little Faith In Me

As Jung states in the Red Book. "The star throws a bridge across death." The star, as Martin Ruland states it, is the living imagination itself in human beings.

Thank you, Tom, for sharing your life with us, with each of us in different ways, and your death too, and post death too, and for leaving your footprints here in your creative offerings for us to cherish.

PERSONAL REFLECTIONS

From Jody Wainer:

Dear Friends and colleagues, as we face the rise of authoritarianism and the destruction of our relationships with countries who have been our friends and allies, it is important to keep in mind the words of the German pastor and theologian *Martin Niemöller, who wrote:

"First they came for the socialists, and I did not speak out—because I was not a socialist.

Then they came for the trade unionists, and I did not speak out—because I was not a trade unionist.

Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out—because I was not a Jew.

Then they came for me—and there was no one left to speak for me."

The words reflected his early complicity in Nazi Germany and later change of heart.

It seems like an extreme example. But they are coming for the judges. And not just the judges. Already they have come for federal employees, transgender people, immigrants, lawyers, the press, epidemiologists, scientists, and more.

The time for all of us to speak up and join forces to protect each other is now, before it is too late.

We're in this together,

Antisemitism an enduring "hate" is often the canary in the coal mine. The very short book (45 minute read) <u>Address Unknown</u> by Kathrine Kressmann Taylor published in 1938 and unfortunately relevant today is worth reading.

Roma is a personal retelling of Alphonso Cuarón's childhood. Set in Mexico City in the early 1970s, it centers on a young indigenous woman who works as a maid for a middle-class white family that's falling apart.

"Roma" is a neighborhood in Mexico City where families live behind locked gates, and where maids, cooks, and drivers busily keep homes running. Cleo lives with and works for a multigenerational brood that scarcely seems capable of doing anything without her. From each dawn until long after dusk, she tends to the family and its sprawling two-story house. She serves meals, cleans away dog droppings, and carries laundry up to the roof, where she does the wash in view of other maids on other roofs with their own heavy loads.

Cleo represents an aspect of the Anima for the Mexican psyche, the dismembered feminine that is part of the mythology of Mexico, as seen in the myth of *Coyolxauhqui*.

In Cleo we see a character that is full of feeling but is never able to speak about her pain. Putting others' feelings and needs ahead of her own suffering. Nevertheless, for Cleo, her feelings are an asset, a source of power. "Calladita te ves mas bonita".

Cleo's story reaffirms the collective trauma experienced by the original people of Mexico and those currently living in the United States.

Gentleman's Agreement is an easy-to-watch, entertaining film: journalist Phil Green (Gregory Peck) takes on a high-profile magazine assignment about antisemitism. To view things from an empathetic perspective, he pretends to be Jewish.

The film was released in 1947, just after the end of the Holocaust. It courageously takes up the Jewish question, exploring the widespread, often subtle antisemitism expressed in "a gentleman's agreement," an unspoken understanding of quotas that limited Jewish people in areas of housing, employment, social circles, and education.

The film boldly discusses the ways people found it necessary to conceal their Jewish identity to navigate these stigmas and social barriers, often changing their last names to sound less Jewish and "pass." In this context, the film touches on Jewish self-hate, which emerges from societies' hierarchical devaluations. It also openly explores, in painful detail, the ways antisemitism manifests in everyday life among people who might not consider themselves overtly prejudiced, enlarging our social understanding of these exclusionary processes.

In recent times, antisemitism has been wildly and a proudly displayed as a courageous stand against colonialism, with being "Jewish" conflated with negative ideas about Zionism and Imperialism. Watching this film in 2025 offers us the possibility to further identify emergent forms of the Outsider archetype, showing how it has morphed to mirror the most despised characteristics in the present era.
